# VP'S "TURN ON THINGS" — JOHN BEECHWOOD



I am starting to get up to speed on the responsibilities of being your vice president and working on the demonstrator schedule and classes. This month, we are fortunate to have Dale Larson. In March, our own Bill Karow will demonstrate making a Bird's Mouth bowl. In April, Rick Rich from Cascade will demonstrate making a table lamp. And in May, Jay Shepard will give a demonstration on finishing. I am also researching future classes, so stay tuned.

For the Monthly Challenges, I will try to follow the previous month's demonstration when I can. The idea is to see the demonstration, then go home and try it. I encourage you to enter new work in the challenge. For example; if you picked up a new tool at the swap meet, show everyone what

you did with it. If not, take any tool that is new to you and show us what you were able to do. The Show-n-Tell is open to any work you want to share, but I also encourage new work.

As I mentioned last month, one of my focus areas is improving our in-house mentoring. So what is a mentor? According to Webster: (noun) *An experienced and trusted adviser*, (verb) *advise or train someone*. What does it take to be a mentor? Who needs a mentor? To me, all you need to be a mentor is information that someone else might find useful and be willing to share that information. I also think everyone can learn something, so everyone needs a mentor. Sometimes showing someone what not to do is just as important as showing what to do! Sharing your success and failures are all part of being a mentor. I am a relatively new turner, having just over three years at my wood lathe, so I am always learning and always seeking new ideas or way to do things. Just the other day, I learned that Cascara (Pacific Buckthorn) has a very, very strong smell!

Like many others I started out by watching YouTube videos and felt some frustration because they make it look soooo easy, and my results were, to put it mildly, disappointing. No matter how loud I yelled at my computer screen, the jerk in the video never answered my questions. Oh, I know I could have typed a question in the comments, and most likely I would get an answer, but not while I was fighting to finish what I had on my lathe. And even if I did get an answer, I would most likely have a follow-on question. So I went to see a demo on sharpening at the local Rockler, and someone mentioned NWWT to me and invited me to join (Thanks, Jim Schoeffel). The information I have gained by just talking to others proved to be invaluable to me.

The first thing I learned was that my ambition greatly exceeded my ability! I was trying projects that were way beyond where I should be starting (thanks to all the YouTube videos making it look easy). I was able to work through it and make some beautiful pieces! But, a bowl that would take me hours to do before, now takes a fraction of the time, and I spend much less time sanding (80 grit makes all turners equal). Not to mention I am much more relaxed and less frustrated than I was before. Sometimes you have to take a step back before you move forward! Before you get frustrated, ask someone for assistance.

I would like to put together a mentor group to help coordinate getting help to those that need it, as well as an education group that can help define areas we need to provide classes. If you are available to help in either of these areas, please contact me. To help facilitate learning, the Board is looking into the feasibility of have an open shop day once a quarter (we are still researching if this will be in cottage 5 or not).



A platter you just finished with that new negative rake scraper? A vase embellished with that new detailing tool. A thin bowl that you used your new wall-thickness gauge on?




Show us what you've created at the February Show-n-Tell and Monthly Challenge presentation!

March of 2019 in shaping up to be an exciting month for woodturners. You will get out of it what you put into it. Come join the fun!



#### Question:

Everything okay here? What would you do differently?

**Answer:** Balancing a turning tool on the bed-ways is always a little risky. You can be cut by sharp tools as you walk by. At least place the tool so that the handle is toward the operator. This way, the tool is a little (not a lot) more likely to land on the handle end first. And the key word is "balanced", a precarious term at best.

**2nd Answer:** Oh, and that handy magnetic switchbox that you can place anywhere on the machine? See how that puppy sticks out where it can hitch on to the hammer loop of your Carharts as you walk by?

#### STUART BATTY WOODTURNING VIDEOS



As one of my volunteer responsibilities at the first Oregon Woodturning Symposium back in 2015, I was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to escort Stuart Batty from the Portland Airport to Albany and back.

Being relatively new to the world of woodturning, I had prepared a list of questions to ask Stuart. Little did I know that Stuart loved to talk. (I think I said 7 words the entire trip.) At the end of that weekend, I had absorbed more than three hours of uninterrupted wisdom from one of the most technically proficient and gifted woodturners of our time.

A year or two before our first Symposium, Stuart had designed and manufactured an incredible line of woodturning tools and produced a series of high quality videos to go along with it. Luckily, his video series is still available on the video sharing site, Vimeo.

I have spent a considerable amount of time watching these. The high production value, clear and thoughtful explanations and Stuart's expertise make these an invaluable learning resource no matter your skill level. I have lost count of the number of the "Aha" moments that I've experienced while watching!

I strongly suggest bookmarking these and watching them repeatedly. There's a lot you can learn from them! I know I still am.


