TIP OF THE MONTH - SHOP MAINTENANCE



I had a little downtime in my shop last month.

Last month while turning, I stopped my lathe for the umpteenth time to check the wall thickness. When I went to turn my lathe back on, it wouldn't respond. My 11-month-old Powermatic 3520C lathe was dead in the water.

After some futile troubleshooting, it still refused to turn back on. I called PM Customer Service (extremely helpful, btw!) and was informed that a switch needed replacing. A new one was mailed out to me free of charge.

Then it hit me... I wouldn't be turning for a whole week. So, I decided to do tackle much needed improvements to my shop while my lathe was out of commission.

I started by cleaning the overhead lighting fixtures. If you haven't done that in a while, I highly recommend it. My shop is noticeably brighter now.

Then a light sanding and oiling (and reorganizing) of my workbench top.

Taking a cue from John Beechwood's article last month, I installed two roller blinds on the ceiling near my lathe to

deflect the chips and prevent the majority of dust from

accumulating everywhere around my shop. Another highly recommended (and low cost) improvement!

The new replacement switch arrived and I rewired it, following PM's clear and detailed instructions.

Roller blinds keep the chips confined.



Now my shop is up and running again. And better than ever.

If it's been a while since you last took a look around your shop for what is working and what could be improved, I recommend doing so. Even small changes can lead to a much better, safer and more enjoyable woodturning experience!

Basic Bowl Turning

Last month's meeting was awesome!

Reed Gray (aka RoboHippy) put on an extremely informative demonstration on his approach to turning bowls.

He emphasized keeping your tools sharp and correctly presenting the tool to the wood. He demonstrated with his scrapers (including his BIG UGLY), bowl gouges and a fluteless gouge. If you need a review of any of his techniques or practices, Reed has produced an incredibly comprehensive library of YouTube tutorials. His videos can be found here.

His adjustable grinding platform (Robo Rest), as well as his uniquely shaped tool rest (Robo Rest Inside Bowl Rest) and Big Ugly scrapers are available for purchase on his website.

Remember the Mirka pads can be used wet or dry and work great on flat work.



JUNE'S TURNING TEASER — ANSWER



June's Question:

Sizing to a larger diameter with a parting tool? SOP, right?

At what point in the parting cut should this photograph have been taken, beginning or end? Why?

Answer: At the End.

The points on the bow-spring (outside) caliper are fairly sharp and are angled at the wood in opposition to each other, making them prone to catch if they are forced onto a spindle against the tension in the bow exerted by the spring. **Never push a bow caliper over a spinning spindle!** Instead, guide the set caliper over the nose of your live center and position the points on the surface of the spindle where you want to part down to your diameter with your parting tool. The arms of the caliper should enclose the spindle at the beginning of the cut. Then, you draw the points into the parting cut until they simply come off over the spindle and away from the spinning material. As with last month, note the grip on the caliper is not white-knuckled, but firm and enclosing.

I like to say: We have no standards, everyone is welcome.


