It would also allow us to get know our fellow woodturners better. And I really like that.



The first one will allow us to send out a notice when we get word of a tree that we can cut up and haul off the wood. STUART BATTY WOODTURNING VIDEOS



In preparation for Stuart Batty's demonstration at our February 2020 NWWT Club Meeting, I thought it would be a good idea to repost this article I originally wrote for the February 2019 newsletter.

As one of my volunteer responsibilities at the first Oregon Woodturning Symposium back in 2015, I was fortunate enough to have the opportunity to escort Stuart Batty from the Portland Airport to Albany and back.

Being relatively new to the world of woodturning, I had prepared a list of questions to ask Stuart. Little did I know that Stuart loved to talk. (I think I said seven words the entire trip.) At the end of that weekend, I had absorbed more than three hours of uninterrupted wisdom from one of the most technically proficient and gifted woodturners of our time.

A year or two before our first Symposium, Stuart had designed and manufactured an incredible line of woodturning tools and produced a series of high quality videos to go along with it. Luckily, his video series is still available on the video sharing site, Vimeo.

I have spent a considerable amount of time watching these. The high production value, clear and thoughtful explanations and Stuart's expertise make these an invaluable learning resource no matter your skill level. I have lost count of the number of the "Aha" moments that I've experienced while watching!

I strongly suggest bookmarking these and watching them repeatedly. There's a lot you can learn from them! I know I still am. —bk


2019 • A YEAR OF CHALLENGES





CASCADE WOODTURNERS 2020 DEMONSTRATORS



I highly recommend attending as many club meetings as you can. You'll learn valuable tips and techniques and can interact with fellow woodturners who share your interest in all things woodturning.



I harvested this Madrone Burl a few weeks back in West Linn, and I've tried to keep it wet or submerged.
