## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE · ROGER CROOKS



Rain returns to the Pacific Northwest, and the best place to be is in your workshop getting ready for the holidays. Rather than hope that a present you need will find it's way off the container ships down south, be sure and make it yourself! It will be much more appreciated.

### COVID

Our vaccine mandate has been welcomed by members and those who commented, said they appreciated the policy.

### **Turning Classes**

Our sold-out Basic Bowl and Spindle classes went extremely well last month. NWWT's value add for these classes are not only the great instructors but also the assistants who provide one-on-one supervision. With six students, we had four of us watching and helping. For example, we could show the student that their bevel was not engaged, and a slight adjustment of the tool turned a ragged cut into a perfect cut. Only with this close monitoring can a new turner learn the right techniques.

One outcome of the classes will be an investment to improving the lathe setups. For each lathe, we will be adding a high-power flexible LED light, steb drive centers, calipers, pencils, rulers, and a small ring adapter for the live centers to ease making fine adjustments on the tailstock side.

### New - Intermediate Bowl Class - November 6

Our first Intermediate Bowl class is coming up and has quickly sold out. This is part of our long-term plan to offer follow-on classes to the Basics series. An Intermediate Spindle class is planned for early next year. You can add your name to the waitlist if you want - HERE

Many thanks to Dave Wood, our Education Coordinator, for coming up with our strategy, planning and implementation of these classes (along with the facility and the donuts!)

## **NEW Advanced Sharpening - Dec 4**

Our Basics Sharpening class covers the basic techniques of sharpening with the Wolverine Jig. While this will solve 90% of our membership's sharpening needs, there are other ways to sharpen, including hand sharpening. This class will teach hand sharpening techniques, tool reshaping, and review other sharpening systems. Register <a href="HERE">HERE</a>

## **November General Meeting - Bill Karow - Embellishments**

Want to see how Bill makes his beautiful pieces? Most of his work uses different techniques to embellish the wood. He will cover Bleaching, Fuming, and Ebonizing with fire, chemical, and India Ink. Examples of each technique will be shown, some with a before and after look. A technical document will also be available with the supplies needed for each technique.

Bill and I recorded this in his one car garage shop, which was organized to make use of every square inch and efficiently laid out.

## IMPORTANT COVID INFORMATION

## NWWT Requires "Proof of Vaccination" for In-Person Events as of October 1, 2021

As a means of increasing the level of safety at our In-Person Events, the NWWT Board unanimously voted to require "Proof of Vaccination" for all In-Person activities – General Meetings, Classes, Open Shop, etc.

Both members and non-members who attend an in-person event shall be fully vaccinated. According to the CDC, people are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer or Moderna) or two weeks after a single dose vaccine (Johnson & Johnson).

## **November Monthly Program Update**

It is hard to believe 2022 is just around the corner. It is interesting to think how far this club has come since March of 2020. At first, we just cancelled the meetings and all activities. Since then, the meetings have become better and better as the quality of Zoom meetings and presentations both recorded video and Interactive Remote Demo's (IRD's) have become more available and much better quality. We have more activities for all levels of our club members than ever before. We are so fortunate to have such a talented group of experienced volunteers. Still to be determined is if we will have both in person meetings that are also available to watch from home. Change in how we do things has been faster than ever expected mostly due to the impact of the Covid virus.









Next up for **November**'s meeting is our own club member, **Bill Karow**, who will be discussing three different finishing techniques that can dramatically transform your finished pieces. For the past three years, Bill has been the editor of our fantastic monthly NWWT newsletter, and he also redesigned our club's logo.




Our first in-person demonstration in 2022, will be at the Multnomah Arts Center in February.

## BASICS COURSES - HUGE SUCCESS!

### Fall 2021 Bowl and Spindle Basics Courses—Huge Success!

NWWT's two entry-level turning courses were held again on October 23rd and 24th. Each class was filled with 6 students and conducted with near one-on-one instruction and coaching by experienced members.

The Saturday **Basics of Bowl Turning** session was captained by Lead Instructor David Williams, a veteran expert turner, and his Assistant Instructor Skip Burke, also an expert turner and long-time member of NWWT. General Assistants Roger Crooks and Dave Wood helped students at the lathes when it came time to put the presentations into practice and make the shavings fly. All instructors and assistants are members of our NWWT "Instructor Corps" who teach all of our club training programs.







We had an abundance of relatively green spalted maple blanks, courtesy of the ice storm last spring that brought down hundreds of trees in our area, and dry maple blanks from the club's inventory.

Class attendees included Mark Maher, Randy Radmer, Anthony Pinkham, Glenn Nord, Eugene Litvin, and Stuart Pemble-Belkan. Students brought their own tools or borrowed from members. Proper tool sharpening is always included in our classes as needed. Sharp tools are safer tools, and they certainly make learning easier under the supervision of our instructors.

We closed the day with a group shot...just to show off our work a little bit. I think we have another crew of expert bowl turners on the way up. We consumed 16 bowl blanks, two large boxes of maple bars and donuts, and we created big smiles and new friendships. And yes, a goodly pile of wood shavings.

On Sunday, 6 different students (except for Glenn Nord who came for both courses) joined us in the shop for the **Basics of Spindle Turning**. Alan Wood, Tim Moore, Keith Strauss, Rick McWhorter and his son Nicholas McWhorter, and Glenn, all braved the heavy rain and high winds to begin learning the techniques of spindle turning. Tom Willing again served as Lead Instructor and Jim Schoeffel (our club photographer) stepped up as Assistant Instructor. General Assistants Roger Crooks, John Sutter and Kevin Jesequel coached at the student lathes on turning and sharpening skills while students learned how to turn a square piece to a cylinder, cut beads and coves, snowman tree ornaments, eggs, boleros, or just more coves and beads! In any case, there were big smiles and strong camaraderie, lots of shavings, and of course donuts!









The wind gusted enough to rattle the sheet metal a few times, the rain poured hard enough to make it hard to hear, and the lights flickered once, but we made it through the day safe, warm, and dry. Spirits were high, in spite of Mother Nature, because it's hard to distract focused and dedicated woodturners!
