POACHERS SUSPECTED OF CUTTING DOWN OLD MAPLES IN WASHINGTON Posted by The Associated Press May 22, 2008 21:45PM

BREMERTON -- Two old maple trees -- one nearly 4 feet across -- were cut down at the Kitsap County Fairgrounds and more than 20 other large maples were removed from the Bremerton watershed.

Officials suspect thieves who take the aged hardwood for use in making furniture or musical instruments.

One man arrested Monday at the fairgrounds and a second man arrested Tuesday in the watershed are facing felony charges.

Officials estimate the value of the fairgrounds trees at \$25,000 and the watershed trees at more than \$10.000.

LIBRARY NEWS



Jim Hall - Texturing

The new addition to the Library for this month been working with wood for a long time inis "Making a Peppermill" with a focus on design deed. Oddly enough "Ideas for Woodturning" by Ted Sokolowski. This is a complete onehour and 50-minute course on making a peppermill and matching salt shaker of salt mill with a strong emphasis on design elements. Chapter titles are: Parts of the Peppermill, Design Your Mill, Find Visual Interest, Prepare the Blank. Bore the Cavities. Make a Jam Chuck, Shape the Mill, Sand & Finish, Assemble the Mill, and the Salt Shaker. Also included is a "goody box" with extras on the following: bandsaw jig, salt mill, underhand grip, rule of thirds, and parallelism. Ted is a woodturner with a visual arts background who brings a unique perspective and insight to his pepper mills. This is a well done DVD with excellent camera shots and clear audio. Unfortunately I have not had the time to make a pepper mill as we have been using the lathe to true the wheels for a pinewood derby race.

As for printed items, I would like to bring to your attention two books that have not been checked out in about four years. "Practical Designs for Wood Turning" but Roland Seale was first published a year before I was born (1958), so it is very odd to read "modern turning" in such a text. However, the projects and designs are to some degree timeless and methods forgotten are bound to be re-invented. If you remember using "glasspaper" you have

by Anders Thorlin lists Toland Seale's book in the bibliography. This book was originally published in Swedish and translated to English in the mid seventies. Both of these books are great to have on the coffee table or lower desk drawer to browse through for a brief woodturning mental break.

INSIDE OUT TURNING BY AL MATHER



My candlesticks and ornaments are made using a method of wood turning known as "inside-out turning."

This method uses four pieces of wood of the same size. I cut the material to be used for inside-out turnings into rough square pieces of 18" - 48" in length. These pieces are squared on two sides, and then finished in a thickness planer to bring all the pieces to the same thickness.

Following the step of cutting all these squares to the lengths desired, I lay them on my worktable and match four pieces into a set.



These are held together temporarily while what will become the inside is shaped. One end of this set is glued to hold the pieces in place while turning.

Upon turning and finishing the inside shape, the set is cut apart on the glue lines, each piece is then rotated 180 degrees in place. The pieces are reassembled and permanently glued for the final turning.

After the pieces are permanently glued, the candlestick is placed in the lathe a second time in order that the outside shape may be formed. A hole is made for the insert at the top and the rest is shaped.



The inside and outside of each piece is sanded to a semi-glossy or even glossy finish with micro mesh®. Each piece is finished with Renaissance Wax®. On some pieces a walnut oil may be used before the wax is applied. All that is left to do is to turn and finish a base piece, mount the candlestick, and insert the metal candleholder in the top.
