#### MATT TILMAN FOLLOWUP by Roger Crooks

Many of you will remember that on Saturday, Sept 24, NWWT helped Matt Tilman, a fellow AAW member who has had to walk away from his favorite hobby due to ALS, sell his shop tools and equipment. Turn out of buyers was good and we sold close to \$5,000 worth of tools. While we pretty much cleaned out his shop, Matt held back a few very nice pieces of wood and asked if someone would finish them for him. Matt has an eye for beautiful wood and could tell you where each piece came from. Well, last month, Roger Crooks delivered about eight bowls to him that were finished by Joe Jedrychowski, Jim Hall, Gary Sundquist, Max McBurnett, Tom Reiman, and Bob Chiavarini, and Mike Meredith had previously finished a few exotic wood bowls. Matt also had a partially finished workbench that he wanted to pay someone to finish. Bill Hamilton, a member of the Guild of Oregon Woodworkers, bought the wood, milled it in the Guild shop, and will deliver it to Matt soon. His family also had two old scroll saws, a drill press and some other items, and they were advertised on the Guild forum for him. This was a win-win situation for Matt and NWWT. Keep your eyes open for opportunities for us to help out fellow woodturners and let us know.

#### TURNIN' N LEARNIN' — CHAPTER 8 by Mike Porter

Hi, once again, fellow "Learnin' Turners"...this past month, I learned that Tom Willing was right. Tom was showing us last month how much wood a wood chuck can chuck (sorry, couldn't resist J) and he said something like "working at the lathe is solving one problem after another...we're in a constant process of solving problems". Sounded OK at the time. I wrote it down in my learning book. Then I experienced it and that's when the learning occurs for most of us. When we experience something, it becomes ours.

In the last week I've made 12 birdhouse Christmas tree ornaments. I used a Sam Angelo YouTube video and an article in a past American Woodturner magazine to make these. Learned a lot!

First, I learned that making many versions of the same item teaches you the process, or you have to create a process and have it be efficient. You naturally seek to improve on what you're doing, not waste steps, do the steps with less fuss, less time, waste less wood. I also found myself experiencing, yes, proficiency! I am more comfortable using the skew, the scrapers, the gouges. But the big "aha" was in the chucking department. To make these small items I needed to shape them, hollow them, reverse them, finish the bottoms, make tops to match the bodies, and so on. Sequencing the work properly, I found, is important! After a few false starts, I had to go back to the video or the magazine article, and re-examine the steps I was taking, make notes, adjust my process and go at it again. I finished the last 5 in half the time of the first 7.

People who see his vases and other pieces often mistakenly think they are glass or glazed ceramic. Anyone looking at them is likely to say "How did he do that". We are extremely fortunate to have him come to our February meeting so we can learn out how he does it.

Michael has been designing for 24 years. After completing an industrial arts program at Palomar College at San Marcos, California, where he created some award winning furniture pieces, he begin creating museum quality reproduction furniture, mainly 18th century American. At a much later date he became fascinated with contemporary design, and changed his focus from furniture to creating art from wood in a very different way. Over a ten-year period color took over, and wood has become a means to create a shape in sculpture as an underlying basis for his art. Color has become the impetus for the art itself.

His work resides in US cities as well as other countries including Canada, Australia, Austria, Scotland, England, the Netherlands, China and Japan.




