#### OCTOBER PROGRAM - REED GRAY (a.k.a. Robo Hippy) - Three Skills for Turning

As Mike mentioned in his column, Reed Gray is an accomplished wood turner and an inventor of "cool things". He will discuss and demonstrate what he considers to be "The Big 3" in wood turning – skills you need to learn as a turner, no matter what type of turning you do, so you can reduce sanding time. These three skills are:

- 1. Tool sharpening
- 2. Presenting the tool to the wood for clean cuts and no catches
- 3. Moving with the tool to get smooth and even cuts.

Most of the demo will be addressing two and three; sharpening will be covered last if time allows.

Reed will also have available for sale some of the innovative tools and accessories he has designed and built (e.g., Robo Rest grinder platforms, and an inside bowl rest), so come at 6:30 so you will have time to talk with him and learn what he has. #### SEPTEMBER PROGRAM – TOM HASTING – NATURAL EDGE PROJECTS

Tom Hasting, owner and woodturner-in-chief at Hasting Coastal Woodworks, a gallery and studio in Newport, Oregon, shared with us various ways to use a natural edge in our turnings. He led us through his process for turning a natural edge bowl:



Selecting the wood

- Picking the turning center
- Shaping the outside of the bowl
- Forming a spigot on the bottom
- Shaping the inside of the bowl
- Using a jam chuck to hold the bowl between centers
- Finish turning the bowl bottom







Bowl, 6" x 7" x 3" H









#### A few key points:

Scotchbroom Goblet

- Select a piece of wood with sound bark or it may come off (see photo of demo piece below)
- It's important to pick the turning center correctly to produce a symmetrical bowl
- Remember that a natural edge bowl is essentially a winged object, so one is turning a lot of air, providing many opportunities for wacked knuckles, or worse




