Might be a good time to check your stock and see how it's drying to avoid losing pieces due to cracking. The weather so far this summer hasn't been too bad, but August is usually hotter and drier.



Art in the Pearl (AIP) is a huge, three day art show over Labor Day weekend in the Portland North Parks District. This juried show highlights the best artists in the area and is always a very well-attended event. While most of the show is for selling products (130 booths), part of the show is an educational area in which invited organizations are given a free booth to do demonstrations for the public, explain what their craft is all about, show sample products (no sales allowed), and recruit new members.

The Guild of Oregon Woodworkers (GOOW) and Pacific NW Woodturners Guild (**PNWG**) have had booths there for many years and are next to each other. The Oregon Carvers Guild has joined GOOW to highlight carving. PNWG has invited NWWT to help with booth duty along with PNWG members. The demo of turning tops is targeted towards kids. Kids can pick colors for the tops, and they walk away with a special keepsake. Donations for a local charity are appreciated. Interacting with the public is a lot of fun. People love wooden items, and we will have carving demos, flat work demos, and turning demos all next to each other.

Tom Willing is in charge of the PNWG booth. I offered to see how many NWWT members would be willing to do a shift over the weekend. It is a great opportunity to educate the public on the joys of woodturning and recruit new members. The show goes from Saturday-Monday (Sept 2-4). We have two 4-hour shifts a day (morning 10-2 and afternoon 2-6). Each shift needs a turner to turn tops and a helper to interact with the public.

JULY OPEN SHOP REVIEW · DAVE WOOD

July's Open Shop was a very busy day on several fronts. We had a full crew using the lathes, and at 10 am we had a demonstration by Dave Wood and Steve Newberry on how to cut up the huge burls donated by Roger Levine. And thirdly, we had our "3 for 2" wood sale going on which resulted in a brisk sales day for the NWWT store. Lots of walnut oil, Anchorseal, CA glue, and sanding supplies went out the door, along with the spindle and bowl blanks.



Cutting the large maple burls properly depends on what you want to get out of the wood. The large dome-shaped portions of these pieces lent themselves best to bowl blanks in our opinion, so we made that our first priority. Next, we looked for the best cubic/cuboid pieces for hollow forms, vases, urns, and other spindle turnings.

For those of you that like to do vacuum stabilizing and resin casting, there are some very nice opportunities for you!







Speaking of food, we had only one mishap at this Open Shop. Because of the large crowd and the shortage of donuts, we did have a couple cases of DDS (Donut Deficiency Syndrome) in the late morning. Fortunately, we had Dr. Steve Newberry on hand to give treatment.

The donut facilitator has been disciplined, and the NWWT Board assures all members this unfortunate oversight will not happen again.






